Charter's spend with CPUC-certified suppliers supporting California operations, as defined and required to be tracked pursuant to GO 156, was 13.74% for fiscal year 2024.

Charter continues to leverage our highly qualified supply base for business needs across the company and our footprint. Suppliers are selected to work with Charter based on merit and the quality of their work toward our various business needs and completion requirements. We have spend with CPUC-certified suppliers meeting these requirements broadly across our business.

The 35 suppliers included within this report have more than \$527 million in total 2024 spend, an approximate 400% increase compared to the spend reported in accordance with GO 156 guidelines. An additional 50 CPUC-certified suppliers have 2024 spend with Charter outside of the scope of this report. Those suppliers represent \$215 million in total spend incremental to the \$104 million reported under the GO 156 parameters. In all, Charter utilized 85 qualified CPUC-certified suppliers who successfully completed work totaling more than \$740 million nationally in support of identified business needs last year.
