ABOUT PACIFICORP

PacifiCorp is a multi-jurisdictional utility providing electric retail service to approximately 2 million customers in six western states including California, Idaho, Oregon, Utah, Washington and Wyoming. PacifiCorp serves approximately 45,900 retail customers in the northernmost areas of California. PacifiCorp's California customers and its electric facilities are geographically dispersed, with only approximately four customers per square mile. The main population centers in PacifiCorp's California service territory are Crescent City, Yreka, and Mount Shasta.

PacifiCorp does not operate within the CAISO balancing authority area, but rather operates two balancing authority areas that encompass its six-state service territory. PacifiCorp's California service territory includes most of the area north of Shasta Lake to the Oregon border. PacifiCorp's California customers currently comprise approximately 2 percent of the Company's total retail sales.

PACIFICORP'S COMMITMENT TO SUPPLIER DIVERSITY

PacifiCorp is committed to promoting supplier engagement and economic development in the communities we serve by building relationships with a wide range of enterprises and small businesses. We are dedicated to using innovative strategies to expand opportunities for suppliers that reflect the people in our communities. Our competitive engagement process ensures that all contractors, subcontractors, suppliers and businesses have an equal opportunity to collaborate with us.

We are committed to fostering a procurement process that is accessible and fair to all suppliers based on their ability to meet the company's performance, price and quality requirements. Our employees are responsible for supplier engagement to identify, qualify, select and manage the procurement process for goods and services to assure that qualified suppliers are appropriately included. Our employees must comply fully with all company policies and practices relating to the engagement of qualified suppliers.

INTERNAL PROGRAM ACTIVITIES

PacifiCorp employs a sourcing model grounded in objective analysis against pre-defined criteria set by our experienced sourcing team. Our overarching goal is to optimize expenditure, ensuring that each dollar spent yields maximum returns while minimizing the total cost of ownership.

We engage suppliers whose practices align with our stringent requirements for safety, quality, risk management, and financial efficiency. Suppliers are granted access to our competitive bidding process, which can lead to a range of contractual opportunities, including master agreements, project-specific engagements, and local procurement through first-tier contractors.

For procurement transactions exceeding \$100,000, PacifiCorp seeks formal competitive bidding to uphold transparency and secure the best value. For transactions ranging from \$5,000 to \$100,000, we allow for a more flexible, informal bidding process to accelerate operations while still maintaining oversight. Operational purchases under \$5,000 are delegated to our skilled operations staff, empowering prompt and efficient decision-making with a streamlined procurement engagement.

PACIFICORP'S SUPPLIER DIVERSITY DATABASE

PacifiCorp maintains an internal supplier database to advance our commitment to supplier diversity, thereby enhancing operational efficiency and inclusivity. In 2025, PacifiCorp upheld our pledge to diversity and transparency by verifying Women, Minority, Disabled Veteran, LGBT, and Persons with Disabilities Business Enterprise (WMDVLGBTDBE) certifications for all listed entities within our enterprise resource planning system. This rigorous process has categorized 602 suppliers with WMDVLGBTDBE status, fostering a diverse supply chain.

Moreover, suppliers are proactively encouraged to register with the California Clearinghouse, aligning with our strategic expansion and stakeholder management goals in the region. Our diverse supplier database is accessible via PacifiCorp's intranet, serves as a resource for procurement teams and field staff authorized for ensuring that the use of diverse suppliers is not only a policy but a practiced standard in our daily operations.

EXTERNAL PROGRAM ACTIVITIES

PacifiCorp was unable to attend the California Public Utilities Commission's Small and Diverse Business Expos or the En Banc in 2025 due to travel restrictions and financial constraints. While PacifiCorp remains committed to fostering supplier engagement and diversity, we also recognize the need to be fiscally responsible and intentional when making discretionary expenditures.

Although travel restrictions were in place during 2025, PacifiCorp did take the opportunity to participate in a local outreach event in Portland, Oregon. PacifiCorp both sponsored and staffed a booth at the Oregon Association of Minority Entrepreneurs (OAME) tradeshow to engage with local, small and diverse businesses to strengthen our supply chain and ultimately stimulate economic growth in the communities served by PacifiCorp. PacifiCorp recognizes the benefits of having a diverse supply chain and is committed to increasing the amount of business we do with minority-owned, women-owned, disabled veteran-owned, LGBT-owned, persons with disabilities-owned and emerging small business suppliers.

PacifiCorp recognizes that an inclusive procurement process that is accessible to a diverse range of businesses is vital to the overall success of our company and excellence in supplier diversity will lead to excellence in supply chain management while providing opportunities for success to a wide and diverse range of businesses in the communities we serve.

PACIFICORP'S SUBCONTRACTING PROGRAM

PacifiCorp is committed to and understands the importance of promoting supplier engagement and economic development in the communities we serve by building relationships with a wide range of enterprises and small businesses and increasing the amount of business conducted with qualified business enterprises, including women-owned, minority-owned, disabled veteran-owned, lesbian, gay, bisexual, and transgender ("LGBT")-owned, and persons with disabilities-owned businesses. Company expects the same level of commitment from prime contractors when they subcontract any of their work.

PacifiCorp continued to partner with a prime contractor to increase diversity spend in support of a major contract in California. A total of 16.35 percent of its California spend was subcontracted to certified diversity suppliers. This partnership led to increased engagement and opportunities with diverse suppliers across our six-state territory.

PACIFICORP OVERALL USE OF DIVERSITY SUPPLIERS

In fiscal year 2025, PacifiCorp's company-wide procurement expenditures reached \$3,663,089,031 marking a 7.4 percent growth from the previous year. PacifiCorp's company-wide engagement with Women, Minority, Disabled Veteran, LGBT, and Persons with Disabilities Business Enterprises (WMDVLGBTDBE) saw a significant rise. Expenditures with certified WMDVLGBTDBE suppliers soared to \$348,472,202, a 30.7 percent increase compared to 2024, underscoring our dedication to diversity and inclusion within our supply chain.

In our California service territory, procurement expenditures totaled \$161,933,736, with \$10,529,351 directed towards certified WMDVLGBTDBE suppliers. This accounts for 6.5 percent of our total 2025 spend in the region, indicating a significant increase from the diversity spend percentage in 2024.

PACIFICORP'S DIVERSITY, EQUITY AND INCLUSION COMMITMENT

PacifiCorp is committed to equal employment opportunity, and we encourage workforce inclusion and belonging. Our company creates and maintains an inclusive workforce free of discrimination and harassment where all employees feel empowered to be their best and to do their best work together. PacifiCorp promotes inclusive hiring and recruiting by engaging in broad based outreach and recruitment and posting job openings internally.

NON-CONFIDENTIAL WORKFORCE DATA

PacifiCorp employs 40 individuals in its California workforce. As reported to the U.S. Equal Employment Opportunity Commission in 2025, approximately 80% are classified as White Male, 3% as Asian Pacific American Male, 15% as White Female and 3% as Native American Male.

NUMBER OF DIVERSE SUPPLIERS (DIRECT AND SUBCONTRACTORS) WHO HAVE THE MAJORITY OF THEIR WORKFORCE IN

Using the information available in the California Supplier Clearinghouse, PacifiCorp determined that six or 50 percent of the diverse suppliers with spend in 2025 have a physical presence in California. Four of those suppliers indicated that the majority of their workforce is located in California. Using the sample calculation provided and the data available from the supplier clearinghouse, percentage of workforce located in California for all diverse suppliers is 38.6%.

Two of the suppliers did not provide any information on workforce percentages located in California and were included in the calculation as having 0% of their workforce located in California.

PACIFICORP'S DIRECT SUPPLIERS AND SUBCONTRACTORS

PacifiCorp is unable to provide the average percentage of its overall direct and subcontractor suppliers who have the majority of their workforce in California. The California Supplier Clearinghouse does not consistently contain this information for certified suppliers or the balance of suppliers utilized by PacifiCorp across its six-state territory.

In a good faith effort to provide this information, PacifiCorp analyzed the supplier database located in our Enterprise Resource Planning (ERP) system. PacifiCorp has a total of 61,055 suppliers in the ERP system and it would be overly burdensome to inquire with each supplier the percentage of their workforce that resides in California. In light of this daunting task, PacifiCorp identified 4,144 of these suppliers or 6.79 percent of the total population have a physical address located in California.

To further refine the data, PacifiCorp identified 5,351 suppliers whom received payments from PacifiCorp for purchase of goods and services across our six state territory in 2025. Of those suppliers receiving payments, 347 or 6.48 percent have a physical address located in California.

DIVERSITY OF THE TOTAL CONTRACTOR OR SUBCONTRACTOR WORKFORCE

PacifiCorp is unable to provide the diversity of the total contractor or subcontractor workforce. This data is not provided by either direct suppliers or subcontractor suppliers and it is unknown if employees of the suppliers voluntarily provide this information.

While PacifiCorp did not meet our supplier diversity spend goals, we had significant success partnering with two prime contractors for utilization of diverse suppliers which significantly contributed to PacifiCorp's diversity spend percentages.

PacifiCorp planned to participate in several local community events as well as the 2025 California Public Utilities Commission business expo and En Banc but due to financial constraints and travel restrictions these opportunities were not realized. In addition, the Oregon Governor's marketplace event was cancelled and rescheduled for 2026. PacifiCorp hopes to be able to participate in more events in 2026, including the rescheduled Oregon Governor's Marketplace, the Oregon Association of Minority Entrepreneurs as well as California Public Utilities Commission planned events.

Challenges to Recruit and Include Diverse Suppliers

PacifiCorp continues to struggle with finding suppliers certified in compliance with General Order 156 for goods and services required in our small and rural California service territory. The majority of PacifiCorp's California spend or 91% is with only ten suppliers, Fortunately, two of these 10 suppliers are certified in the supplier clearinghouse and are largely responsible for the increase in our diversity spend percentages in 2025, along with PacifiCorp's partnership with prime contractors to subcontract with diverse suppliers.

Another barrier experienced by PacifiCorp was the expiration of Clearinghouse certifications for two key suppliers. With such a small diverse pool of suppliers, the inability to include this additional spend was a hinderance to reaching our goals.

PLANNED WMDVLGBTPDBE INTERNAL PROGRAM ACTIVITIES FOR 2026

PacifiCorp will continue to inform and educate executives and their direct reports, procurement staff, operational staff and all Company employees who interact with suppliers on the program to increase supplier diversity. This will be accomplished with individual training sessions as well as Company-wide newsletters and publications.

Operational staff will be more directly involved in communicating the Company's goals and expectations to suppliers and prime contractors.

PacifiCorp supply chain is working on a charter for a new supplier diversity team that will include both supply chain, business unit representatives and management to more actively engage various stakeholders within our Organization. The high-level vision includes identifying potential opportunities for diverse suppliers and local vendors, partnering with prime contractors to develop their supplier diversity programs and seeking out opportunities to assist in the development and competitiveness of diversity suppliers through instruction, mentoring and other outreach activities.

PLANNED WMDVLGBTPDBE EXTERNAL PROGRAM ACTIVITIES FOR 2026

PacifiCorp plans to attend the CPUC Small Business Expo and the 2026 En Banc held in the fall. PacifiCorp will also continue to identify and participate in supplier diversity workshops, events and other activities such as the annual Oregon Association of Minority Entrepreneurs trade show and the Oregon Governor's Marketplace to promote and improve our supplier diversity program.

PacifiCorp can also impact communities through our supply chain investments. While utility suppliers are often multinational or large firms, PacifiCorp is seeking ways to localize and diversify our impact. Our commitment is to actively and routinely seek out qualified minority, women, disabled veteran, LGBTQ, persons with disabilities and small business enterprises that can provide competitive and high-quality commodities and services. In addition, we strongly encourage our prime contractors and major suppliers to support supplier diversity by creating a competitive procurement process that provides opportunities for diverse supplier subcontractors and businesses. We are working to onboard and purchase from more diverse businesses and intend to develop additional training for potential diverse suppliers. Persistent efforts are often required to make continuous improvements in all the communities we serve. PacifiCorp is ready to make these investments and develop new supplier relationships.

PacifiCorp continues to encourage prime contractors to subcontract with diversity suppliers. Primes are required to submit a supplier diversity plan, including confirmation that they have contacted diverse suppliers and obtained their commitment to participate.

PacifiCorp successfully negotiated a major contract which specifies the use of technically qualified and economically competitive diverse subcontractors and suppliers for at least 10 percent of applicable work or materials. PacifiCorp will continue to work collaboratively with this contractor to identify diverse businesses through certifying agencies and outreach events planned for several locations throughout our service territory including California. PacifiCorp plans to use this engagement as a model for future contracts.

PacifiCorp will consider the recommendations by the Commission's Supplier Diversity Staff for the achievement of maximum results in implementing legislative policy and General Order 156 consistent with the WMDVLGBTPDBE program guidelines.

Challenges to Recruit and Include Diverse Suppliers

PacifiCorp continues to struggle with finding suppliers certified in compliance with General Order 156 for goods and services required in our small and rural California service territory. The majority of PacifiCorp's California spend or 91% is with only ten suppliers, Fortunately, two of these 10 suppliers are certified in the supplier clearinghouse and are largely responsible for the increase in our diversity spend percentages in 2025, along with PacifiCorp's partnership with prime contractors to subcontract with diverse suppliers.

Another barrier experienced by PacifiCorp was the expiration of Clearinghouse certifications for two key suppliers. With such a small diverse pool of suppliers, the inability to include this additional spend was a hinderance to reaching our goals.

Strategies to Overcome Barriers to Utilization of Diverse Suppliers

PacifiCorp will continue our attempt to recruit additional certified suppliers in the areas of electrical construction, vegetation management, engineering and wildfire mitigation, which encompass the majority of our California spend. In addition, expanding partnerships with prime contractors is also a strategy PacifiCorp will pursue as additional large projects are identified and planned. Finally, PacifiCorp has reached out to the two suppliers whose certifications lapsed prior to 2025, and one of them has already become recertified.
