The audit included a review of the District's operation and maintenance records for the years 2008 - 2010, and random field inspections of some of the District's facilities. ## **SUMMARY OF INSPECTION FINDINGS**

## A. PG&E's Internal Audit Findings

Prior to start of the audit, PG&E provided CPSD the results of PG&E's internal audit of the District's records dated May 20, 2011. Some of PG&E's internal audit findings are violations of PG&E's operation and maintenance standards, and are therefore violations of Title 49 Code of Federal Regulations (CFR), §192.13(c). All the violations that PG&E identified are noted in Milpitas District Internal Review Summary Table. CPSD also identified violations of Title 49 CFR 192 in relations to PG&E's internal audit findings.

CPSD is aware that some of PG&E's Internal Review findings have already been corrected or were in the process of being corrected at the time of the audit. Please provide CPSD with an update on items that had pending corrective actions as of May 26, 2011.

## B. Audit Findings and Violations

Title 49 CFR, §192.481 Atmospheric corrosion control: Monitoring states in part:

"If atmospheric corrosion is found during an inspection, the operator must provide protection against the corrosion as required by §192.479."

CPSD noted the following deficiencies recorded in the Regulator Station records in the section "General Station Condition Issues":

Regulator Station

Piping Atmospheric Corrosion

Martin Station, Daly City Sullivan Ave, Daly City Surface Rust, Needs Some Attention Lots of Atmospheric Corrosion

CPSD verified these conditions during the field portion of the audit. Therefore, the District was in violation of 49 CFR, §192.481 for not taking corrective action to control the atmospheric corrosion at the regulator stations. Please advise CPSD on the status of the atmospheric corrosion found at these regulator stations.
