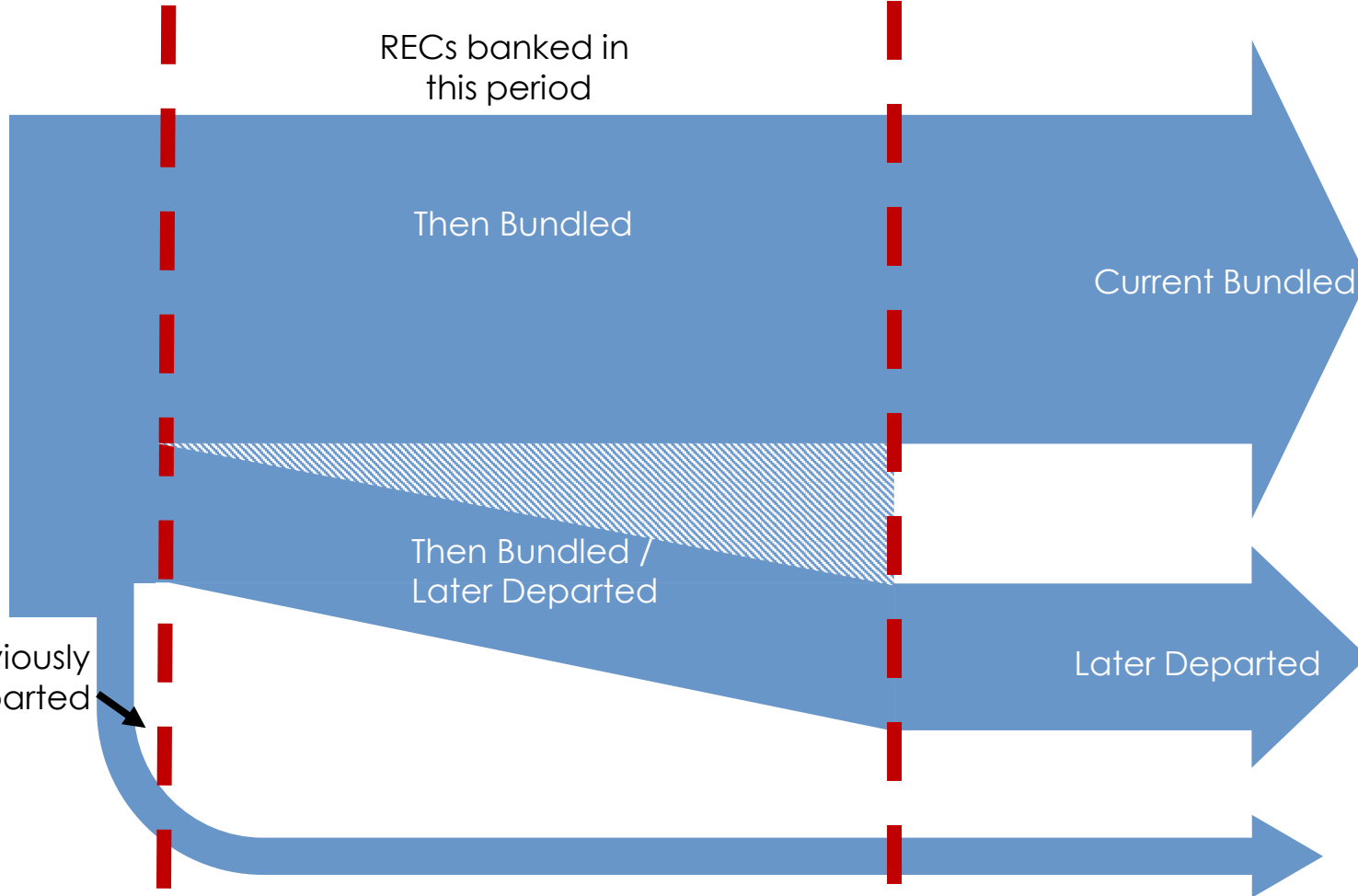

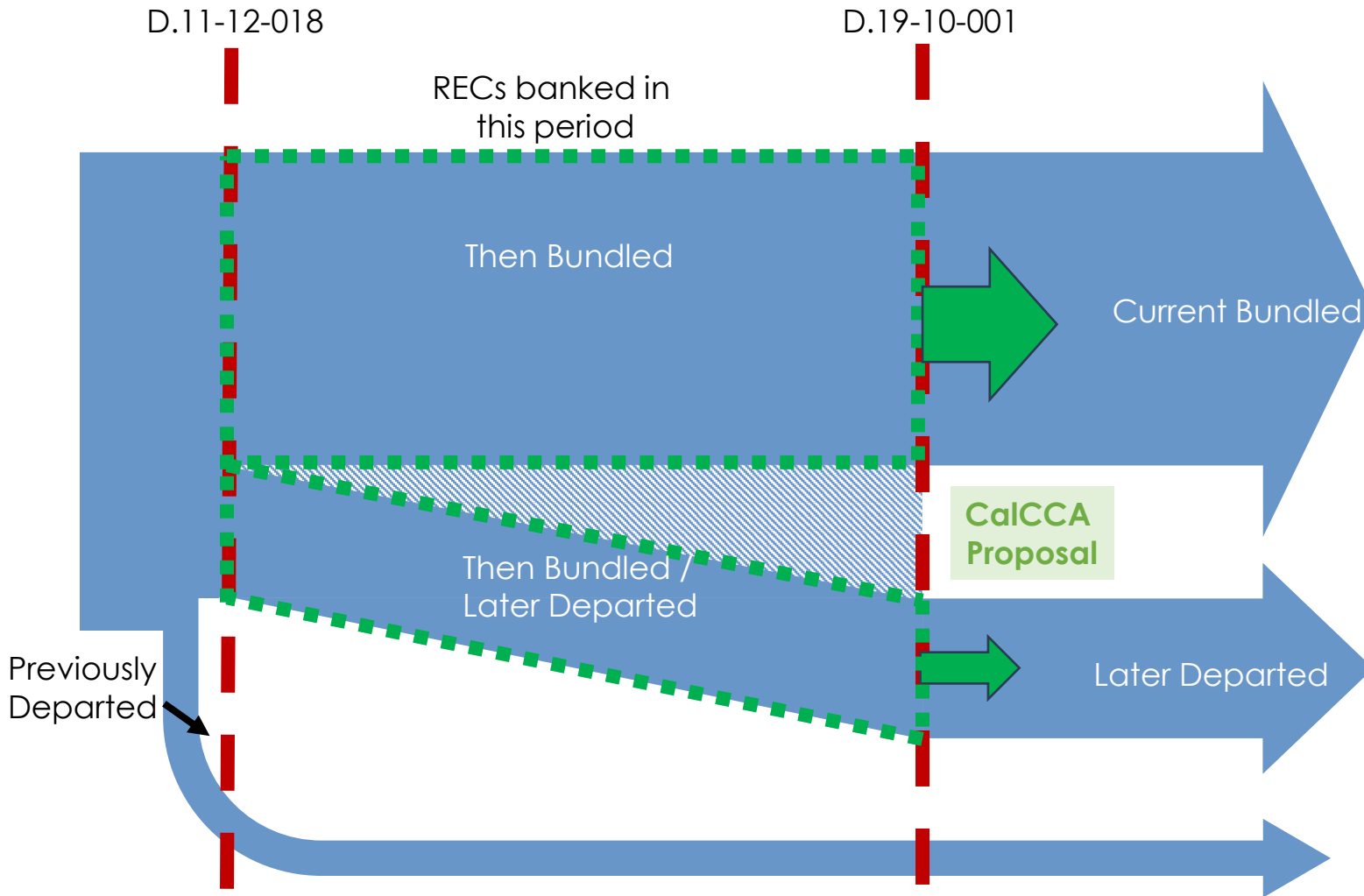

- Requires Staff to submit any future deployment changes requiring National Telecommunications and Information Administration (NTIA) approval, including other program elements and any supplemental deployment activities, to the Commission for ratification via resolution, following NTIA approval on an annual basis, or more frequently as necessary.

About BEAD

- \$42.45 billion federal grant program
 - Goal: connect every American to reliable, affordable, and scalable high-speed internet
 - 56 states and territories
- Administered by National Telecommunications and Information Administration (NTIA)
- California's allocation is \$1.86 billion to serve nearly 270,000 locations
- Substantial programmatic changes in program in 2025
- Final Proposal outlines NTIA approved subawards



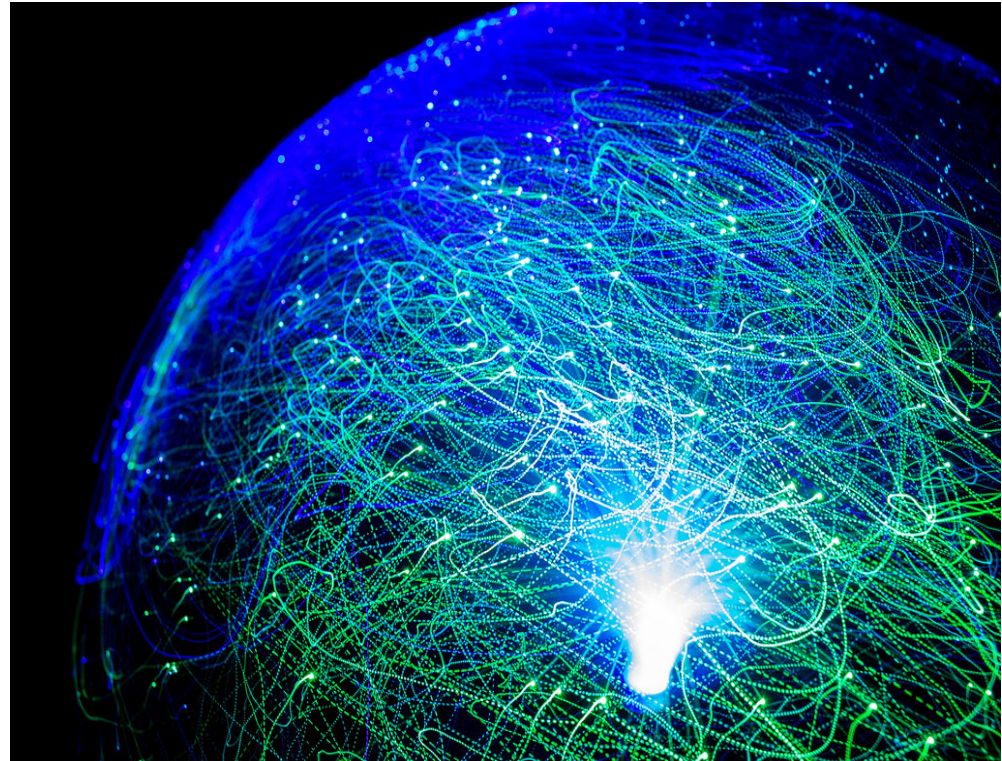
California's Results

Accomplishments

Achieved a technology solution for 100% of all BEAD eligible locations in California

Achieved lower than average cost per location than most Western states, and below the national average

Fiber will serve the majority of locations and comprises the most deployment funding

Item #43 [24442] – Tribal Consultation and Land Transfer Policies

R.22-02-002

Order Instituting Rulemaking to Implement Resolution E-5076 and Review of Tribal Policies.

Quasi-Legislative

Comr. Houck - Judge Kao

PROPOSED OUTCOME:

- Adopts revisions to the California Public Utilities Commission's (Commission) Tribal Land Transfer Policy (TLTP) and Tribal Consultation Policy.
- Directs the Office of the Tribal Advisor to assist tribes in identifying the service areas of investor-owned utilities that may overlap with their self-identified ancestral lands; and to quarterly convene a Tribal Information Forum, inviting all California tribes, for information exchange to address issues within the Commission's jurisdiction and relevant to tribes.
- Closes the proceeding.

ESTIMATED COST:

- Incremental costs for investor-owned utilities to implement the TLTP are not estimated but anticipated to be minimal.
